

U.K. MODERN SLAVERY ACT STATEMENT

Dril-Quip is committed to taking all reasonable steps to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in any part of our business or in our supply chains. This Statement is made pursuant to s.54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the "Act") by Dril-Quip (Europe) Limited on behalf of Dril-Quip, Inc. and all of its subsidiaries and as Dril-Quip's primary contracting entity for UK operations.

References to "Dril-Quip", "we" and "us" in this statement refers to Dril-Quip, Inc. and its subsidiary companies, including Dril-Quip (Europe) Limited.

As a leading manufacturer of drilling and production equipment for use by oil and gas companies in areas throughout the world, we place a high value on ethical practices and recognize that some areas pose higher risks for slavery and human trafficking. In addition to our manufacturing facilities in Aberdeen Scotland, we have significant manufacturing facilities located in the United States, Singapore and Brazil. We provide goods and services in the UK, Europe, USA, South America, Africa and Asia Pacific.

Our employment processes ensure that all employees are legally entitled to work in the country of employment and we have various safeguards in place to ensure employees are protected whilst in our employment. These include:-

- Pre-employment checks;
- Adherence to legislation in respect of the minimum wage and national living wage requirements;
- Any overtime working for hourly employees is voluntary and recompensed;
- Employee Handbook;
- Grievance, disciplinary and confidential whistleblowing procedures;
- Code of Business Conduct and Ethical Practices;
- HSE policies and procedures to ensure safe working environments.


We have a significant supply chain all over the world, working with a whole range of different subcontractors and vendors and we are committed to ensure that our supply chains will comply with the Act.

We have provided training to our applicable HSE, QA, HR, contracts, procurement and supply chain staff within Dril-Quip (Europe) Limited on the Act to help identify any potential slavery and human trafficking and how to respond if slavery or human trafficking is suspected. The training is supervised by our legal department and we have taken additional steps in 2019 to enhance and update this training.

Dril-Quip (Europe) Limited has also included the Act as part of its vendor qualification processes by requiring vendors to complete and submit a modern slavery due diligence questionnaire together with supporting documentation to demonstrate their compliance with the Act. The due diligence questionnaire, together with supply chain procurement practices, will continue to be reviewed during 2019 and periodically thereafter to ensure Dril-Quip (Europe) Limited's expectations are met in relation to its vendors' compliance with the Act. Dril-Quip (Europe) Limited's terms and conditions of purchase have also been updated to ensure our vendors have the same commitment to prevent slavery and human trafficking as we do. We will not work with vendors who do not demonstrate a commitment to compliance with the Act.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2018 and was approved by the board of Dril-Quip (Europe) Limited on 02 July 2019.
